We have appointed a First Nations woman to our Board of Management. Vicky Peters, a Dja Dja Wurrung, Yorta Yorta woman, is an experienced leader in health, higher education, and Indigenous services, with a strong focus on achieving health and wellbeing outcomes for First Nations people in Victoria and Australia.

She is currently Director First
Nations Health at Eastern Health.
Prior to this, Vicky was the Director
of Indigenous Engagement at
Swinburne University, responsible
for developing initiatives focused
on Indigenous employment,
philanthropy, and procurement.

She also built a reputation as a trusted mentor and strategic advisor, with a proven track record in Indigenous student recruitment, policy development, and service coordination across both the education and health sectors.
